Jack L. Ryle served as the Executive Director of the Texas Police Association from 1992 until 1998. Jack began his law enforcement career in 1954 as a police officer with the McAllen, Texas Police Department. He moved to Abilene, Texas Police Department in 1959 and served with that agency until 1970. During his tenure there, he earned a Bachelor's Degree from Hardin-Simmons University and was an instructor and coordinator in their Criminal Justice Program.

He then accepted a position with the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education (TCLEOSE) in 1970 where he performed many valuable services, including the development of recommended curricula for College and University Criminal Justice Programs. When the State Legislature created the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas (LEMIT) as a function of TCLEOSE, Jack was selected to head the program. He was instrumental in structuring the program and served as manager of the Institute until it was transferred to Sam Houston State University.

In his honor, the Texas Police Association created the Jack L. Ryle Scholastic Scholarship to assist TPA Members' children who are embarking on a college, university, or trade school educational program.
